Reserve early! Reserve campsites two days to nine months in advance by phone, Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687), or online through www.oregonstateparks.org.

Detroit Lake State Recreation Area's campground offers nearly 300 sites by the shore of a forest-ringed canyon reservoir in the Cascade Mountains. The nine-mile-long lake is a popular destination for fishing, boating and other water sports. Sightseers enjoy views of snow-capped Mt. Jefferson in the distance.

Seasonal Camping

(Open April – October)

- 107 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- 69 electrical sites with water
- 98 tent sites with water nearby
- Paved parking, picnic tables, fire ring at all sites
- Showers and flush toilets
- Swimming areas
- Firewood for sale

Universal Access

Three campsites (F24, F25 and G30) are accessible to campers with disabilities.

Camping Rates

Discovery Season

State park Discovery Season rates are in effect at Detroit Lake from October 1–31 and April 1–30. During those months, you can rent a full, electric or tent site for \$4 off summer rates.

Camping Restrictions

Campsites are limited to eight people per site, and **only one extra vehicle is allowed per campsite** due to environmental restrictions. All vehicles must be parked on the pavement in the site, or in a designated parking area. Once a site has two registered vehicles, no other vehicles can enter that site. We strongly recommend visitors purchase enough sites to accommodate all their vehicles. Park staff strictly enforce these regulations.

Other Amenities

Detroit Lake has a playground area for children six and over (in A Loop). The park also has horseshoe pits, a basketball court and volleyball areas. Borrow equipment at the registration booth.

Schedules for interpretive programs, offered mid-May through mid-September, are posted at the visitor center and registration booth. Junior Ranger activities are offered daily in July and August.

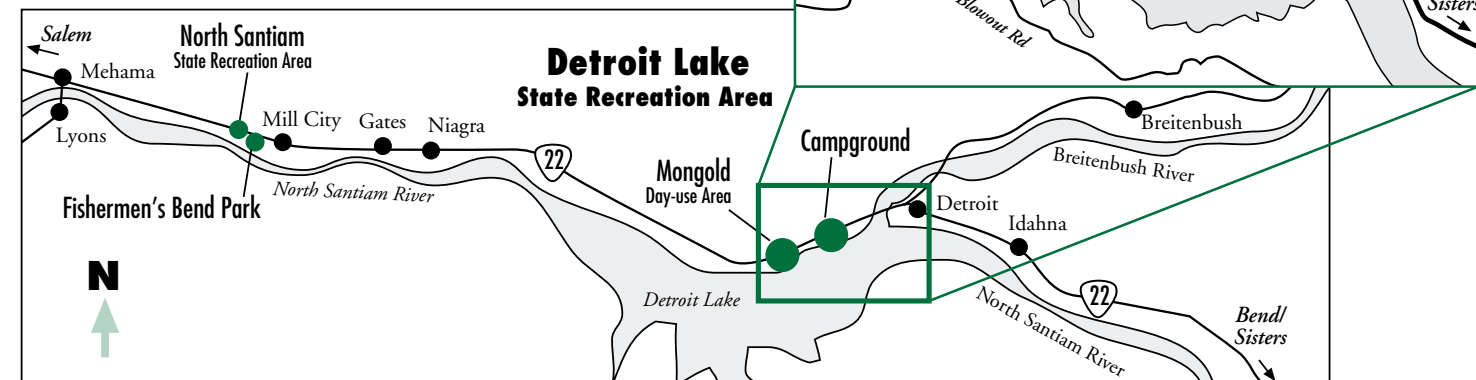
Boating and Fishing

The fishing dock is accessible from the F Loop area. Anglers can expect to find rainbow trout, catfish, kokanee (landlocked blueback salmon), and landlocked chinook. Courtesy boat ramps are located in D and G Loops, with 15-minute time limits for loading and unloading passengers and gear. Boat trailer parking is available at the G Loop ramp. Overnight boat moorages are available in F and H Loops and may be rented by registered campers.

Mongold Day-Use Area

Mongold Day-use Area is located 1.2 miles west of the campground on Oregon Highway 22. It offers year-round boating access, weather permitting. Facilities include:

- Large paved boat ramp with spacious parking areas and seasonal courtesy dock
- Enclosed swim area with a grass "beach"
- Restrooms with changing rooms
- Picnic area
- 72 single-car and 120 RV/trailer parking spaces

Overnight parking at Mongold is permitted if you are camping on Piety Island or on a shoreline accessible only by boat.

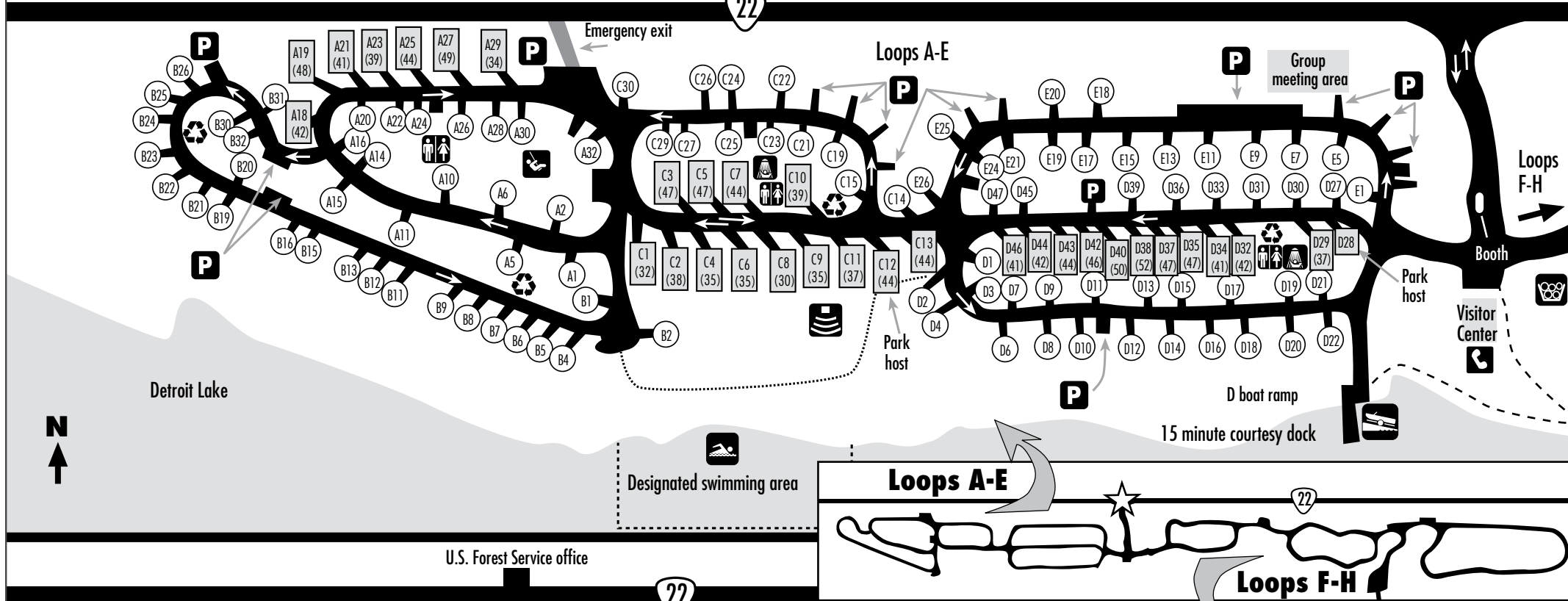
Day-Use Area Fees

Day-use permits are required year-round in both the Mongold Day-use Area and the campground. You will need to display either a daily permit, a 12- or 24-month permit, or a camping receipt. Your camping receipt is equal to a daily permit for those days registered if displayed on the driver side of your dashboard. You may purchase a daily permit at the entrance booth or from a nearby yellow vending machine. The 12-month and 24-month day-use permits are sold in the visitor center and at major state park offices.

More Information

The Detroit Lake Visitor Center has more information on activities and services in the area. The center has a store where you can buy gifts, educational toys, bagged ice and soft drinks. You also will find first aid and a lost-and-found area.

Please help make camping safe and enjoyable. Follow these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.

Note: No dump station available. Nearest dump site is at Fishermen's Bend Park, 24 miles west.
